### **Earthquake Ready Burnside Bridge Project**

Portland's aging downtown bridges are not expected to withstand a major earthquake. That's why Multnomah County is taking the lead on making at least one crossing earthquake ready. This project has now entered an Environmental Review Phase. The County wishes to share early information in advance of a formal environmental analysis to get committee feedback. Project team members are seeking input on four items: the four bridge alternatives, bridge cross-sections, traffic management approaches during construction and draft evaluation criteria. Presenting will be representatives from Multnomah County, the Portland Bureau of Transportation and the consultant team.
