

Types of Project and Code Issues

1. Code Intent & Purpose

- Why do we have a Tree Code? What are its goals?

2. Implementation Protocols and Deliverables

- What has been put in place (processes/staff) to accomplish the Tree Project objectives?

- What are the adopted or needed policies that standardize decision-making?

3. Code Fixes & Clarification

- Where is the Tree Code silent, unclear, or inconsistent?

4. Resources, Staffing, and Budget

- Are these sufficient to achieve project goals?

Issue #5: Building & Attached Structure

Code Section: 11.40.050

Issue:

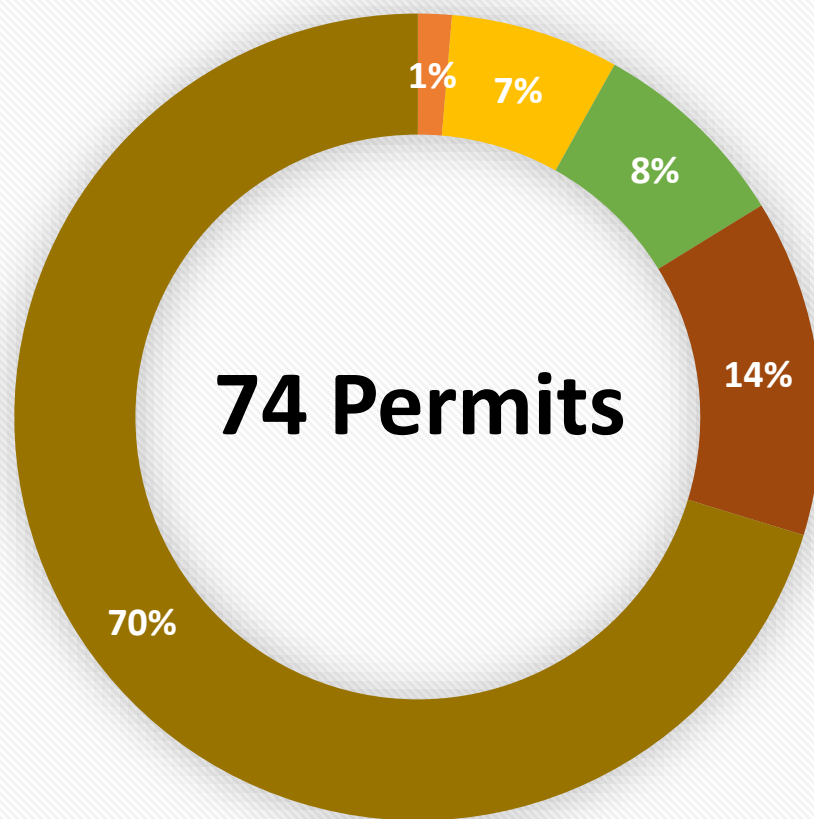
- Trees of any size, species, or condition qualify for a Type A permit and tree for tree replacement when the tree is within 10 feet of a building or attached structure
- 20% of Private Tree removal applications cite 10 feet as a reason for removal*
- There is no definition of building or attached structure in *Title 11, Trees*

*366 permits submitted, 74 cited 'within 10 feet' as a reason for removal (1/2/15-3/1/15)



Issue #5: Building & Attached Structure

Issue #5: Building & Attached Structure

Jurisdiction	Definition of Building
Portland	A structure that has a roof and is enclosed on at least 50 percent of the area of its sides.
Bend	A structure which is designated and suitable for the habitation or shelter of human beings or animals or the shelter or storage of property, or for the use and occupation for some purpose of trade or manufacture.
Hillsboro	A structure having a roof supported by columns or walls, which is built for the support, shelter or enclosure of persons, animals, or property of any kind.
Seattle	Any structure which is used, designed or intended to be used for human habitation or other use.



Issue #5: Building & Attached Structure

Proposed Definitions:

- Building: Permitted Structure that has a roof, is enclosed by at least 50%, and has an in ground foundation that covers at least 10sqft
- Attached Structure: Any permanent structure with an in ground foundation that covers at least 10sqft that is attached to a building by a common wall, a roof, or by structural connections that allows pedestrian access to both structures.



Issue #7: Waiver Policy

Code Section: 11.40.060 C

Issue:

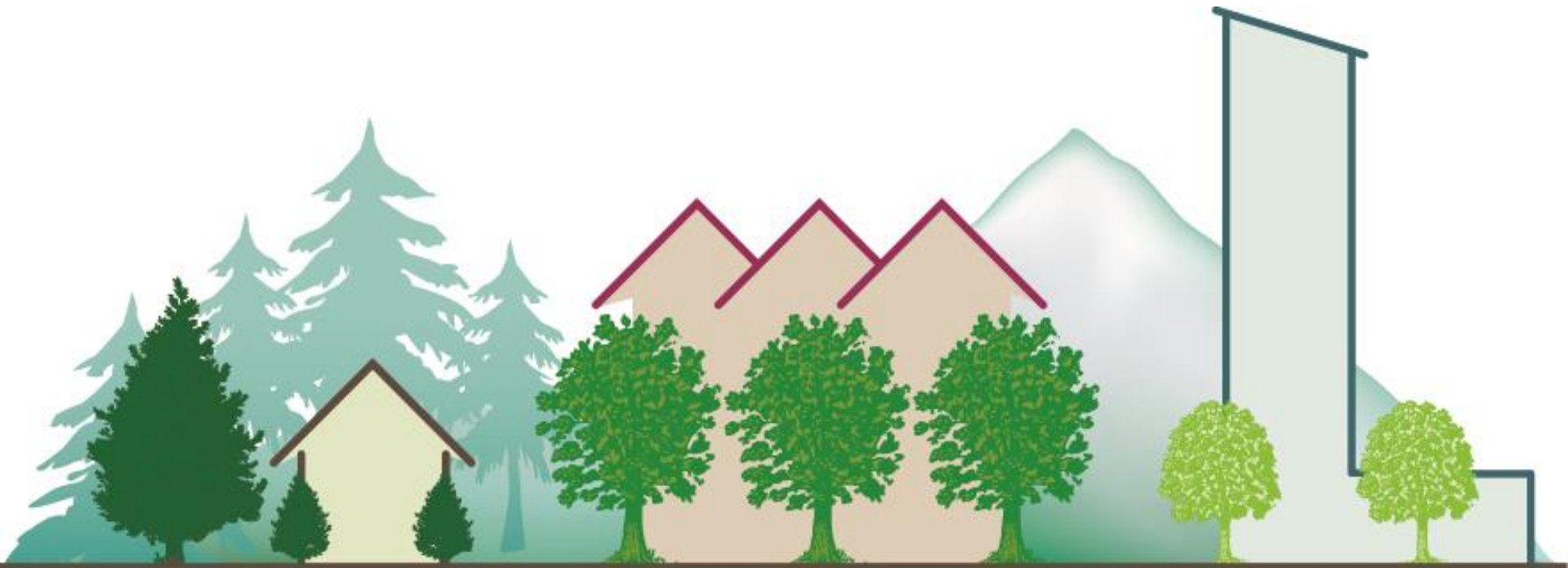
There is an option to create a waiver when full mitigation would create an “unreasonable burden” on the applicant.
