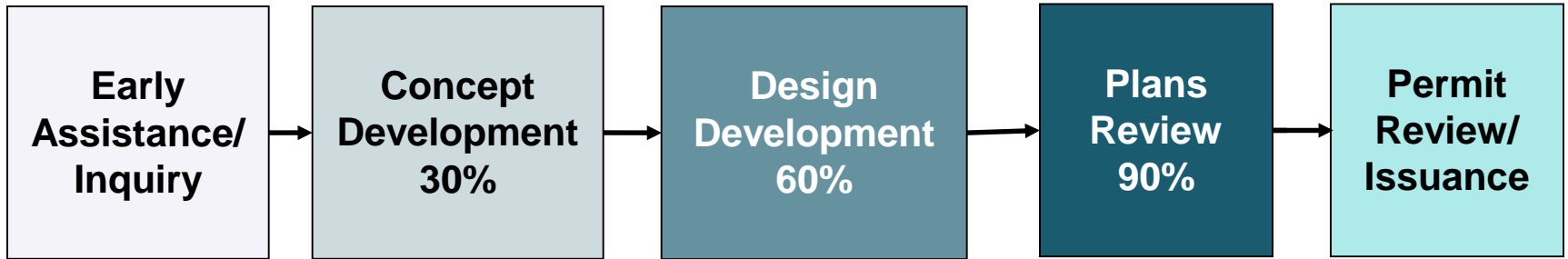


What is a Public Works Permit?

PWP Project = privately-funded and constructed public improvement permitted by an infrastructure bureau

- Plans designed by professional engineer
- Improvements constructed by private contractor
- Does not include over-the-counter/connection permits
- Does not include water facilities constructed by the Water Bureau within existing rights-of-way

What is the public works process?



- **Public Works Inquiry** - coordinated information early
- **Concept Development (30%)** – project scope approval
- **Design Development (60%)** – project engineering acceptance
- **Plans Development (90%)** – final detail resolution
- **Permit Issuance** – final document and fees provided

Tie-ins with Urban Forestry at all review phases (EA governed through BDS process, others through PBOT or PWP).

Integrated Appeals Process

- One “gateway” for all public works appeals
- Appeals can be made at any decision point in the process
- Three levels of “appeal”:
 - Alternative Review Committee
 - Public Works Administrative Appeals Panel
 - Public Works Board of Appeals
- DRAC and neighborhood involvement in Appeals Panel
- When tree issues involved, UF is consulted
