3 things you can do to help salmon in Portland

1

Only rain

down the drain.

Recycle used motor oil and dispose of household chemicals properly—never down storm drains.

2

Plant trees.

Trees catch and soak up rain to reduce street runoff, keeping pollution out of rivers and streams. They also help keep the water cool for salmon and other fish.

3

Drive less.

Bike, walk or take public transit. When it rains, motor oil and other pollutants from cars can wash into our rivers and streams.
