

## WHAT'S HAPPENING NOW

You will notice a new item on the look ahead schedule accompanying this update, "Tower Crane 1" and "Tower Crane 2". Crews are preparing the site so these two cranes can be erected on-site, one this spring and the other this fall. Once in place they will tower over the site, and be able to lift structural elements and materials into place.

**Beginning Monday, April 2, 2018, SW Sherwood and SW Sacajawea will reopen.** The roads will be reopened to vehicle traffic, but some pedestrian paths and parking areas will remain closed. Look for new maps mid-March, posted on the project webpage.
